The Department for Education requires governing bodies of maintained schools to publish a statement of behaviour principles for their school. This statement is to be offered as guidance for the Headteacher in composing Christ the King School's behaviour and discipline policy by stating the principles which governors expect to be followed.

Governors' Statement of Behaviour Principles

- Every pupil understands they have the right to feel safe, valued and respected, and to be able to learn free from the disruption of others
- All pupils, staff and visitors are free from any form of discrimination
- Staff and volunteers set an excellent example to pupils at all times
- Praise, consequences and reasonable force are used consistently by staff, in line with the behaviour policy
- The behaviour policy and behaviour curriculum is understood by pupils and staff
- The suspensions and exclusions policy explains that exclusions will only be used as a last resort, and outlines the processes involved in suspensions and exclusions
- Pupils are helped to take responsibility for their actions
- Families are involved in behaviour incidents to foster good relationships between the school and pupils' home life

The school will have an effective and easily understood behaviour policy developed by our headteacher through consultation with governors.

The governing board also emphasises that deliberate, dangerous or threatening behaviour will not be tolerated in any circumstances.

This written statement of behaviour principles is reviewed and approved by the governing board annually.
