

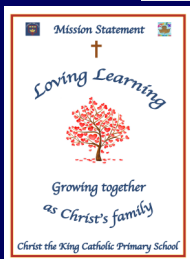

St Therese House



St Therese of Lisieux is known for the simplicity and practicality of her approach to the spiritual life. She saw herself as “the Little Flower of Jesus” because she was just like the simple wild flowers, growing and giving glory to God. She believed we are all God’s little flowers and her ‘little way’ teaches us to do ordinary things of line with extraordinary love.

St Bakhita House

St Josephine of Bakhita was born in 1869 in Sudan and kidnapped by slave traders at the age of 7 before spending 12 years in slavery. As a slave she moved from Africa to a convent in Italy where she won her freedom and became a Christian, For the rest of her life she was known for her gentle voice and smile, devoting herself to promoting Catholic missions in Africa.



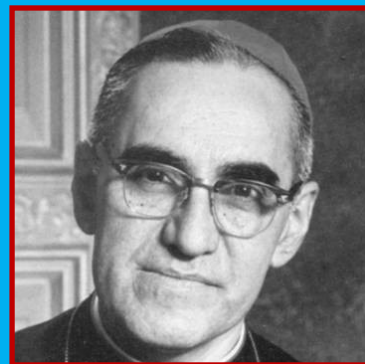
St James House



St James was one of the disciples of Jesus Christ, he was a fisherman with his brother John, before becoming a disciple. Following the crucifixion of Jesus, James made a pilgrimage to Spain and Portugal to spread the word of Jesus. Christ the King School was built to replace St James school when it became too small and old. The scallop shells on our school badge are a symbol of St James.

St Romero House

Oscar Romero was the Archbishop of San Salvador who was assassinated in 1980. At the time there was civil war in the country and he repeatedly spoke out against violence, urging soldiers to remember God’s words, “Thou shalt not kill”. He was a peace-maker who sacrificed his life standing up to injustice. We can all follow his example by challenging injustice wherever we see it.
