



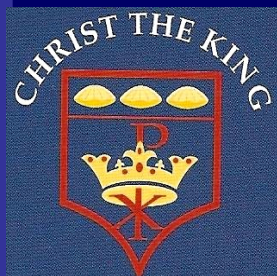

Mobile Emergency Alerts test in Reading



A new government Emergency Alerts system is being tested in Reading next week on Tuesday 29 June, between 1-2pm. The scheme allows the government and emergency services to send alerts to mobile phones in a specific area to warn people of emergencies, such as severe flooding or terror attacks.

If you receive an alert on your mobile phone, you'll hear a loud, siren-like sound and a message will appear on your screen to tell you about the emergency and how best to respond.

If you receive a test alert, you won't need to do anything on this occasion. The alert may be received by anyone who is in Reading at the time but the message on screen will reassure people it's just a test and no action is necessary.

If the test is successful the system will be rolled out across the country for use when lives are in danger. You can find out more about [Emergency Alerts](https://www.gov.uk/emergency-alerts) on the gov.uk website.

Reading COVID-19 walk-in vaccination service – now extended to all adults

We are seeing rising cases of COVID-19 in Reading, including of the 'Delta' variant first identified in India. People who have not received a vaccine are more likely to become ill or be hospitalized as a result of catching the Delta variant. Reading Borough Council is working with the local NHS to ensure people can get a vaccine if they have not had one yet.

They are running an extra vaccination service until Sunday 27 June for:

- people in Reading;
- aged 18 and over;
- who have not yet had any doses of the Covid-19 vaccine.

Details of the service:

- The clinic is at the Civic Offices, Bridge Street Reading, RG1 2LU.
- It is open every day until Sunday 27 June, 9.30am - 8.30pm.
- You do not need an appointment. You may need to queue.
- You should bring a mask to wear in the building and, if possible, proof that you live, work or study in Reading.
- There is no car parking at the site. You can walk or get the bus, and the nearest car parks are at the Oracle or Broad Street Mall shopping centres.
- The vaccine administered at the clinic is suitable for people under 40 and pregnant women.
