School Building Fund

They have a massive iPad in the play room where daddy played games with Alex and I would colour on it too. We also had a magician come to visit the play room and I was his magical assistant.

I'm looking forward to being back at home with my family and can not wait to see my friends at school again. I will still have to do lots of physiotherapy at home at least 3 times a week for the next 4 months, so I may be a little tired when I do come back to school.
