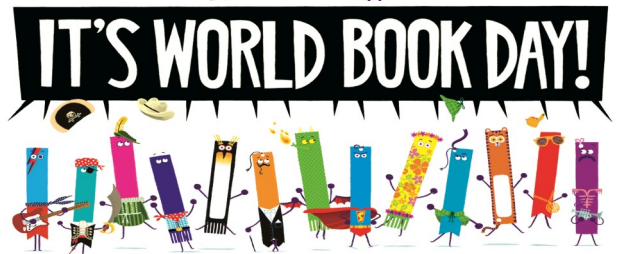
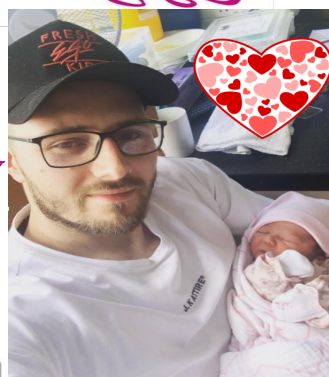

SEND Local Offer Reminder - Max Cards, Care Passport & Me2 Club

We encourage families to register on the [Disabled Children & Young Peoples Register](#) to receive their free **Max Card**. The Max Card gives discount at all Merlin attractions such as Lego Land and countless local attractions such as Krazy Play Days and Beale Park.

Once the parent/career has registered their child or young person on the Children & Young Peoples Disability Register (DCR), then they will have the option to create a care passport.

The care passport can be completed by the parent/career, to provide information about the young person, which can be used when attending short breaks, activities etc.

Me2 Club to your families promote in the school would have to fall within the following 5 wards, Kategrove, Redlands, Park, Church and Whitley and therefore only children living in these wards will be eligible to register.

Parents and professionals will be able to register a child for support to access a mainstream activity with help from a Me2 Club volunteer.

Chance to Shine Street brings cricket to thousands of young people in urban areas. It uses the game to increase aspiration, promote social cohesion and create opportunities in diverse communities. It's a fast-paced version of the game played with a tape ball - a tennis ball wrapped in electrical tape - in small enclosed spaces.
