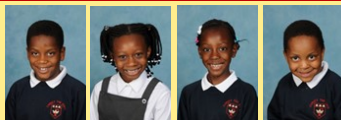
No NUTS

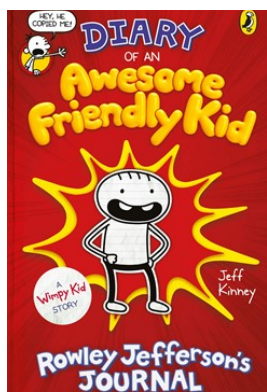
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Alfie really likes Diary of the Awesome Friendly Kid

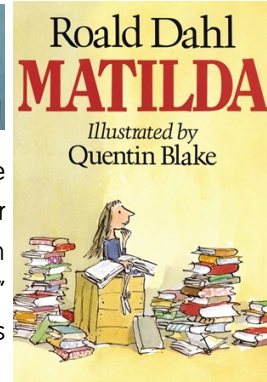
