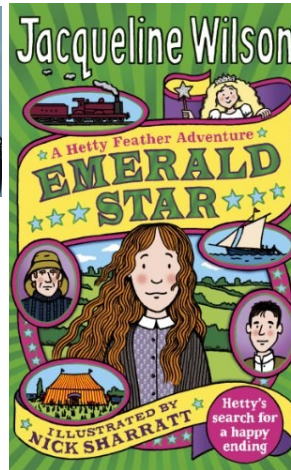


Chioma recommends
