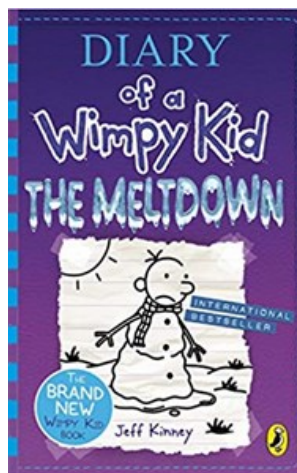


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Can we recommend?

Every week this term we will ask children to recommend their favourite books so that other children can enjoy them.

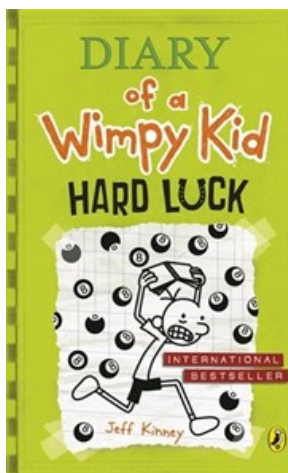


Andrew's favourite is
