This is a book review about 'GRANDPA'S GREAT ESCAPE' by David Walliams. I will show you what I think about this book.



The main characters are: Jack, Jack's grandpa and Jack's mum and dad, there's a funny bit where Jack's grandpa believes he's flying his spitfire on the church spire!

Grandpa is very old and often gets confused. He thinks he is a prisoner of war when he gets sent to an old folks home. His grandson gives him supplies so he can escape. But do they succeed?

Here's the blurb: "Many years ago grandpa was a world war II flying ace. But when he is sent to old folk's home Twilight Towers-run by sinister Matron Swine-it's up to grandpa and his grandson, Jack, to plot a daring escape. Little do they know, the wicked Matron is on to them..."
