Alex Dryden who plays the cello and took part in the Berkshire Maestros Christmas performance last week.

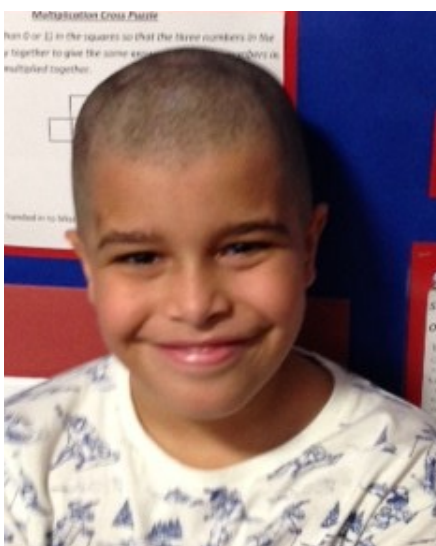

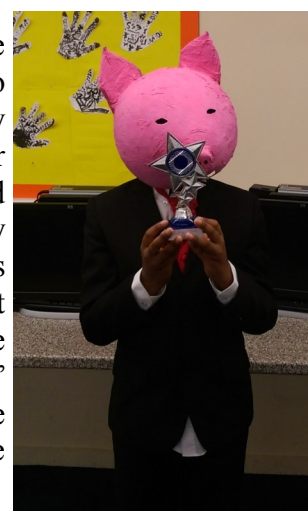
